Safety instructions

● GENERAL

Please read these safety instructions carefully before putting the device into operation.
Always keep these operating instructions near at hand.
Heed all warnings labelled onto the device and specified in the operating manual.
Under no circumstances should you allow children unattended use of electrical devices.

● AMBIENT CONDITIONS

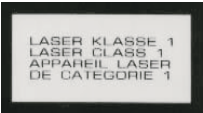
Protect the device against humidity and heat.
Make sure that no foreign bodies or fluids get into the device.
Do not place fluid-filled receptacles on the device.
Do not expose the device to dripping water or splash water.
If placed on furniture, the device's rubber pads might lead to changes in surface colour. If required, place the device on an appropriate protective cover.
Do not place open fire sources such as candles on the device.

● AC POWER SUPPLY

Always connect the device to an easily accessible power outlet (230V ~ 50Hz), which is located in the immediate vicinity of the device.

● DVD PLAYER

The DVD player is a Class 1 laser product.
The unit is equipped with a safety system preventing the emergence of dangerous laser beams during normal operation.
To avoid injury to the eyes, do not manipulate or damage the safety system of the device.



● MALFUNCTIONS

In case the power supply cord or the device is damaged, pull the AC mains plug immediately.
Under no circumstances should you attempt to open and/or repair this device on your own. Refer all servicing to our Service Centre or another qualified service shop.

● ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

Used batteries do not qualify as household refuse.
The batteries must be disposed of at the designated collecting points.



● CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE

Prior to cleaning, unplug the mains plug from the outlet. For cleaning, always use a moistened, soft cloth. Do not apply chemical solvents or cleaning agents, as they may damage the surface and/or labelling of the device.

Remove all packaging material.

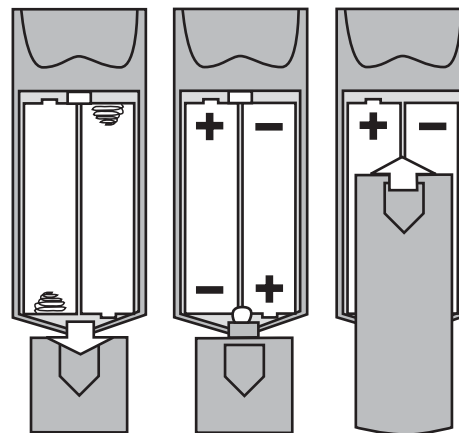
ATTENTION!

Inserting batteries into the remote control unit

Included in the scope of delivery are two AA batteries (1.5V)

- ▶ Push the cover of the battery compartment on the rear downward and off the remote control unit.
- ▶ Insert the batteries so that the negative pole of the batteries sits close at the springs.
- ▶ Push the cover of the battery compartment back on again.



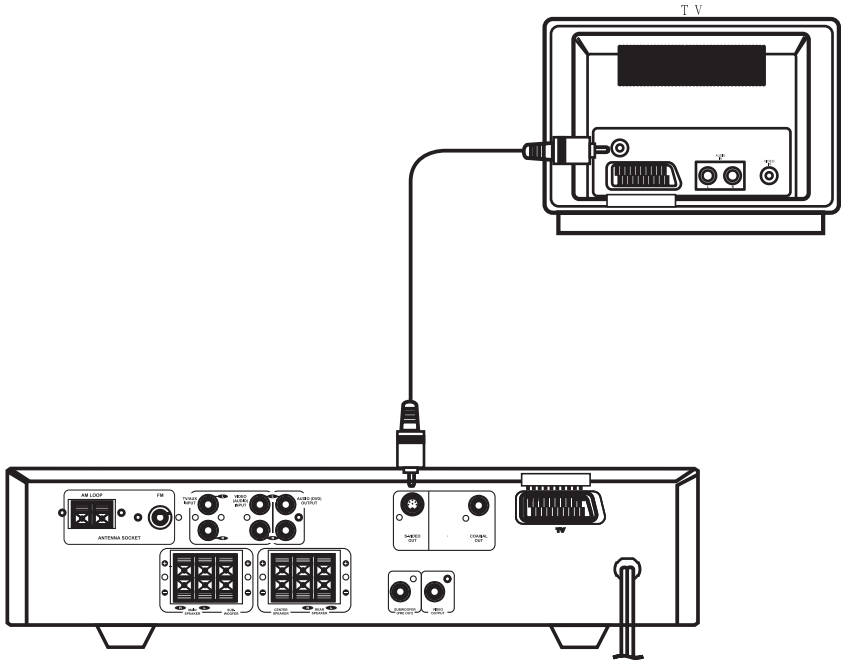
ATTENTION!

The enclosed batteries must not be charged, dismantled, thrown in a fire or short-circuited. Batteries may cause risk of death if swallowed. Therefore keep the batteries and the remote control in a place which is inaccessible to children. If the battery is swallowed, seek medical help immediately.



Connection to the TV set via S-VHS cable

If your TV set does not have a SCART plug, you can connect it to the unit via a S-VHS cable (S-VIDEO jack). This provides you with a good image quality.
The sound transmission does not require a connection to the TV set , since the sound is transmitted to the speakers.
If you would like to transmit the sound to the TV set anyway, use an additional audio cinch cable.

If your TV set does have neither a SCART connection nor a S-VIDEO jack, you can connect the unit also via a video cinch cable.
